EDITORIAL NOTE

Namaste,

In this issue of the newsletter, we are sad to let you know about the passing of Karnataka's most famous shadow puppeteer, Nadoja Shri Belagallu Veeranna. His career spanned decades as a legendary puppeteer in the state. At the Rangayana in Mysore in 2018 it was a great honour to chat with this illustrious performer. My experience watching the "Mahatma Gandhi -Bapu" shadow play can only be described as amazing. A mystical shadow show was the product of a collaborative effort among his children, relatives, and friends. Our deepest condolences go out, on behalf of all of us, to the grieving family members who, with the same level of commitment as the Master, are working to preserve the art in the manner that he had envisioned. Still, we were all deeply saddened to learn about Penny Francis, MBE's passing on June 29, 2023. Penny was a longtime member of the Union Internationale de la Marionnette and a co-founder of the Puppet Centre Trust. She also taught puppetry at London's Central School of Speech and Drama, edited the journal "Animations," wrote "Puppetry: A Reader in Theatre Practise," and translated and edited major works by Henryk Jurkowski. Penny was born in the Elgin Nursing home in India-Calcutta in 1931, and she and her family resided at 2/3 Lansdowne Road. She attended the "Rathlin Hall" school in Darjeeling beginning in 1939, and then the "Hilltop" school in Kalimpong from then until she relocated to the United Kingdom in early 1944.

In addition to this, on June 25, 2023, we were treated to an amazing Live Session of the ANUBHAV 4 series featuring Wilde and Vogel from Germany. The number of people who registered for the Zoom meeting surpassed nearly one hundred for the first time ever, and in addition to puppeteers from all over the world, many others work in the performing arts, education, and visual arts. 

Karnataka's shadow puppeteer Nadoja Shri Belagallu Veeranna (1936-2023)

The art of puppetry dates back centuries. Art that is relevant to the present moment is vibrant. One form of traditional art that has survived to the modern period is leather puppetry. The original folk artist can no longer survive on a commitment to traditional practices alone. Only artists and art lovers are capable of preserving and enhancing works of art. The Shillekyat community's crown treasure, Shri Nadoja Belagallu Veeranna, a shadow puppeteer from the state of Karnataka, added a completely new dimension to leather puppetry. Veteran puppeteer and theatrical performer Belgal Veeranna is credited

with popularizing leather puppetry in India and other countries. The puppetry heritage has been modernized, experimented with, and revived by Mr. Belagallu Veeranna. Given that "Leather puppet means Veeranna, Veeranna means leather puppet", it is appropriate that he be credited with establishing the genre.



Veeranna was born on July 6, 1936 in the village of Belagallu in the Bellary Taluk in the Bellary District of Karnataka. In Bayalayata theatre, his late father, Hanumanthappa, played the violin and performed in leading female parts. It's intriguing to learn how a Bayalata performer becomes a Shadow puppeteer. The late Shri Vijay Sasanoor, Director of the Department of Kannada and Culture in Bengaluru, questioned Veeranna in 1980. Shri Sasanoor was interested in a folk theatre production from Veeranna's hometown of Bellary. Despite the fact that many members of his community use shadow puppetry, Veerana asserted on the spot that he is a performer in the Bayalata and has no knowledge of it. The director then asked him to contact the people in his neighbourhood, create a performance, and stage a shadow puppet play at Ravindra Kala Kshetra. He then approached his elder sister's shadow Puppeteering family and learned the art from them. He then scripted and performed the shadow puppet drama "Panchavati". Thus, he began his career as a shadow puppeteer and christened his troupe Sri Rama Anjaneya Togalu Gombe Mela. As we are all aware, Smt. Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay extended moral and financial support to traditional artists and craftsmen. Veeranna also received this support, which allowed him to pursue his ambition.

The Shadow puppet show performances drove him to Switzerland and other European countries. He has appeared in over a thousand distinct performances. Despite having a well-known name, a prominent position, and the respect of society, he is a relative unknown. Belagallu Veeranna's godmother, Belagallu Mahalingamma, was the driving force behind all of his accomplishments. He was the previous chairman of the Karnataka Yakshagana-Bayalata Academy. The Hampi University Nadoja award was bestowed upon him. He has received numerous literary awards and scholarships. 1992-Karanataka Natak Academy award, 1992-Karnataka Rajyostava Award, 2000-Karnataka Janapada and Yakshagana Academy Award, 2007 Janapada Shree Award, 2011 Sangeet Natak Academi Award.

It is a positive development that his children and grandchildren are trained and performing members of his troupe, carrying on the art form.

A tribute to Penny Francis (1931-2023)



Penny Francis is a puppet activist, writer, editor, and lecturer from the United Kingdom. Penny Francis, a professional actress who first became interested in puppetry thanks to her actor husband Derek Francis, has co-produced four shows of string puppetry. She devoted time and energy to advancing the craft of Puppetry as a performing art, ensuring its continued success by improving its infrastructure, spreading its talents, and producing works of the highest quality. She was very well-versed in its history across Europe and had a cursory familiarity with its development overseas. Penny loved reading because she had such an interest in the English language and how it was used, abused, and developed. She has worked as a Reader in Theatre Practice, an editor, an essayist, and the author of the book PUPPETRY.

In addition to her many other accomplishments in the field of puppetry, Penny is credited with establishing The Puppet Centre in London. On their Facebook page, they wrote, "Penny was a fiercely intelligent advocate, enthusiast, catalyst, provocateur, educator and communicator, writer, and champion of puppetry" Penny born in Calcutta, India in 1931 at Elgin Nursing Home, she lived with her parents at 2/3 Lansdowne Road (no longer residential flats). She attended initially a School in Darjeeling that was called "Rathlin Hall" in 1939 and then in Kalimpong, the school was called "Hilltop". She was there from 1941 to early 1944. From about 1929 or 1930 till the partition in 1948, her father worked for the Calcutta Electric Supply Corporation. In 1944, when the Suez Canal was newly opened, her family made the perilous journey back to the United Kingdom. Penny's many and varied contributions to the world of puppetry will be remembered for a long time. She not only worked at The Puppet Centre, but she also served as the editor of their journal, Animations, for a number of years. Penny also contributed to the development of the Puppetry curriculum at the London Central School of Speech and Drama. Also was a published author, having written Puppetry: A Reader in Theatre Practice (Macmillan), and also translated the works of her close friend Henryk Jurkowski, a prominent puppet scholar. Her major works are translated and edited by Henryk Jurkowski, her long work with the Union Internationale de la Marionnette, and her joyous embrace and support of puppetry and puppeteers wherever she found them.

"Penny and I have known each other from the early 70's we have worked together in UNIMA international and met at numerous festivals and events all around the world .Penny was a great friend of many of us puppeteers in India she encouraged and wrote about them , she has been a guest at our EC meeting in 2003 in Delhi, for all of us in the puppet world we say we shall never forget you Penny Francis may you live long in our hearts and memories."

UNIMA Council 2023 - Highlights

Shri Dadi Padumjee was physically present, and Ms. Anurupa Roy joined virtually. Fantastic Indonesian shadow puppet performances, as well as ritual-based performances, folk performances, and performances from other nations, were on display during the council meeting. However, many hiccups and errors occurred during the conference meetings, elections, and voting due to language translations and technology challenges, not unlike the political condition in most nations today. Ms. Anurupa Roy, who represented UNIMA India, was unable to cast a ballot because she lacked the means to connect to the internet in time. She has repeatedly emailed UNIMA International about the problem, but has not yet received a response. Despite the numerous tragic and unexpected events that took place in Bali, the tourism, meetings, and idea exchange that took place there were unquestionably the finest part. Chuncheon, capital of South Korea's Gangwon Province, will host the ensuing session of the UNIMA Congress in the year 2025.

The puppet play "Bishnu Prasad Rabha" has been performed. Simanta Sarma, a Senior Fellowship recipient from the Indian Ministry of Culture, wrote the puppet play "Bishnu Prasad Rabha." The puppet play was performed by Binita Devi, Palak Koiri, Niharika Das, Gitima Das, Dhruba Jyoti Kalita, Hardik Sarma, Kristi Rajbongshi, and Trishna Kalita. The characters in the puppet play are voiced and composed by Adishna Rajbanshi and Apalak Sharma. Abhijit Burman is in charge of directing the play. The play shows how Bishnu Prasad Rabha awakened the people through music, recitation, drama, etc. during the freedom movement.

They did not fight with any weapons but went forward and defeated the enemy through cultural means. The play portrays how the freedom movement awoke all ethnic groups, rich and poor, in a beautiful way. The puppet show is performed with shadow puppets and stick puppets. There was no inertia in the movement of the puppets in the puppet play. The audience felt that the play was performed by human beings. Every scene touched the hearts of the audience. The audience at the "Amrit Yuva Kala Utsav" in Agartala was enthusiastic about the play "Bishnu Prasad Rava." 

ANURUPA ROY




As a part of the silver jubilee celebrations of the Katkatha Puppet Arts Trust announced the **Puppet Incubation Lab**, an open call to invite applications across India. The selection will be on the basis of the projects proposed and the work previously done. The shortlisted applicants will be engaged in a 15 day workshop with multiple conductors and Indian mentors who could work online after the workshops. The workshop will include masterclasses and facilitate improvisation sessions where artists get to create together. The final output will be the start of their own final projects which are collaborative and cutting edge. Four of these selected projects will receive a grant of up to rupees 50,000 and this group will meet for the final advanced lab for 12 days culminating in their presentations. Between the two workshops the mentors, will hold sessions with the teams online between October to November. In December the teams will perform at the Goethe Institut / Max Mueller Bhavan, New Delhi, who have also supported this project.

SPHOORTHI THEATRE FOR EDUCATIONAL PUPPETRY, ART AND CRAFT-STEPARC

As part of the activities offered at the Summer Camp, a puppetry workshop was put on by Sphoorthi Theatre for Educational Puppetry, Art, and Craft (STEPARC), in collaboration with Oxford Grammar School in Himayathnagar. The storytelling sessions were open to people of all ages, beginning at four years old. On the other hand, workshops on puppetry were offered for youngsters older than 8 years old. Even while everyone was welcome to listen to stories, the older children were encouraged to participate in the creation of puppets and the staging of performances using puppets. A well-known folk tale that has been told in many different ways in different parts of the world was presented and retold. After that, a common plot base was scripted, and it was tailored to fit the Indian culture, language, and nature in general. Following that, practice was had in both the voiceover and the dialogue rendition through the use of group role-play. After then, an attempt was made to construct something brand new out of the trash and other waste items. Therefore, the "Trash Puppets" were constructed using straightforward methods. A fantastic presentation of 'Magic Soup Story through Trash Puppets' was given by the participants of the summer camp on the occasion of the closing ceremony on May 28, 2023. This was accomplished through rehearsal and practice.





Sphoorthi Theatre-Little Champs presents "31 Dosas" for the 7th time at Hyderabad's Salar Jung Museum.

As part of Summer Art Camp at the Salar Jung Museum in Hyderabad, the Sphoorthi Theatre STEPARC-Little Champs presented the Hindi adaptation of "31 Dosas" on May 10, 2023. Fifth through ninth graders from Oxford Grammar School in Himayathnagar, Hyderabad, are the stars of the Sphoorthi Theatre STEPARC-Little Champs puppet show. Twenty students have received instruction in puppet construction, storyboarding, scripting, voice acting, music composition, and performance. These kids have appeared at the National Book Fairs in Hyderabad and Vijayawada, as well as the Dhaatu International Festival in Bengaluru and the National Puppet Festival at Lok Kala Mandal in Udaipur, Rajasthan.





Wilde and Vogel, Figurentheater In 1997 the musician Charlotte Wilde and the puppeteer and puppet maker Michael Vogel started their company, first in Stuttgart, from 2003 in Leipzig, where Wilde & Vogel are co-founders of the International Centre for Animated Theatre Westflügel. Puppetry and Live-Music are the artistic means of Wilde & Vogel's theatre. Themes and dramatic material for the productions are manifold. They are always questioned concerning the adequate means of expression and reduced to the essence, to open room for imagination beyond the visible for the audience. Apart from classical drama (Hamlet, Faust, Orpheus, Salomé) and adaptations of novels (Krabat, The Hobbit, Frankenstein), musical material (until doomsday, Toccata) or poetry (Spleen, Songs for Alice) there is also a group of performances which base on original themes (Siberia, The Sensibility of the Giants, Dust, Kukułka). Co-operation with directors and colleagues from different artistic fields are essential for Wilde & Vogel and there are several international productions. Since 2007 Westflügel Leipzig has been the premiere theatre and also co-producer of all Wilde & Vogel plays. FITZ Stuttgart has been partner and co-producer since 1997
